## MEET THE SPEAKERS: DR. AGBOR-ENOH TOPIC: “FIRE-SIDE CHAT”- COVID 19 PANDEMIC AND REINVESTING IN AFRICA’S HEALTH SECTOR.....

Dr. Sean Agbor-Enoh was born and raised in Cameroon, West Africa. He received his M.D. at the University of Yaoundé, Cameroon after which, through a Fogarty International Center Scholarship, he was accepted to Georgetown University Medical Center, Washington DC. There, he completed his Ph.D. and post-doctoral training in Molecular Biology followed by an Internal Medicine residency at Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center. He also served as Chief Resident in Internal Medicine before completing a joint fellowship in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at the NIH Clinical Center and Johns Hopkins Hospital.

He later on accepted a clinician scientist position in Dr. Hannah Valentine’s Lab at the NHLBI before applying for and receiving the competitive and prestigious Lasker Clinical Research Fellow and NIH Distinguish Scholar Awards. He also receives funding from three other sources. Currently, he has a joint appointment as a tenure-track investigator at NHLBI Pulmonary Branch and as a lung transplant pulmonary physician at Johns Hopkins. His Laboratory of Applied Precision Omics (APO) is based at NHLBI, with an extension slated to open in April 2021 at Johns Hopkins. Dr Agbor-Enoh was recently recognized as one of 1000 most inspiring black scientists in the United states.
